**Current Board Positions** (Currently filled positions are through December 2016, with elections in November 2016):

- President – Jamie Stetzel – American Structurepoint, Inc.  
Runs the day to day operations of the chapter, is a champion of the organization, runs the monthly meetings, coordinates with the committee chairs and chapter leadership.
- Vice President – Eric Pethtel – City of Fishers  
Assists the Chapter President with the day to day functions, stands in place of the president if absent, and coordinates with committees.
- Treasurer – Shan Gunawardena – City of Ft. Wayne  
This position is responsible for keeping our books, collecting funds, cutting checks, an annual budget, monitoring chapter investments, monthly reporting to the board, semi-annual report to APWA National, and any documents needed for the annual audit to National.
- Secretary – Lori Rushin – Eilts Consulting Services  
This position keeps all records, correspondence for the chapter, minutes of the meetings, and reports to National as needed with Chapter activities.
- Delegate – Eric Pethtel – City of Fishers  
The chapter delegate represents the chapter at regional and national delegates meetings. They disseminate information about the chapter and national to membership and the chapter board.
